## Quincy A. Lucas Bio

Quincy A. Lucas, president/founder of Witney's Lights, Inc., is a native of Baltimore, Maryland. She is a two-time graduate of Delaware State University where she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education and a Master of Arts degree in Curriculum and Instruction. Quincy is currently pursuing a doctoral degree in organizational Leadership at Wilmington University.

Quincy has served as an educator and community liaison for nearly two decades. Her awards and honors are numerous, ranging from the 2001 Jefferson Award for humanitarian service to being selected as a Links, Inc. Scott Hawkins Leadership Institute Fellow, an honor bestowed to only 47 young women worldwide who demonstrate exceptional leadership ability. In 2010, Quincy was honored with the Delaware State University Distinguished Alumni Award for her numerous contributions to local and global communities.

While Quincy is proud of her accomplishments, it is the establishment of her 501-C(3) non-profit organization, Witney's Lights, Inc. that drives her passion. Witney's Lights was founded in honor of Quincy's sister, Dr. Witney Holland Rose, who in 2003, at the age of 34 became a victim of domestic violence homicide at the hands of her ex-boyfriend. Witney's Lights is a grassroots organization committed to eradicating domestic violence through awareness, education, prevention, advocacy and a commitment to advancing the initiatives laid out in the landmark, Violence Against Women Act of 1994.

Since her sister's murder, Quincy has spoken throughout the country on the topic of domestic violence and victim advocacy. As a result of her dedication and courage, Quincy was chosen by the Obama/Biden campaign to place into nomination then -Senator Joseph R. Biden, Jr., author of the Violence Against Women Act, as the vice president of the United States of America. Quincy is both the first Delawarean and first African American woman to play this pivotal role in the election process. In 2009 she had the distinct honor of serving as the keynote speaker for the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Victims of Crime Act at the National Crime Victims Rights Week Observance sponsored by the United States Department of Justice under the leadership of United States Attorney General, Eric Holder. Quincy currently resides in Dover, Delaware with her husband, of 24 years, Dr. Kevin A. Lucas, and their three children, Malcolm, Victoria and Benjamin.





## WITNEY'S STORY

### *Her Life...*

Witney Holland Rose was a native of Baltimore, Maryland. She was born on December 12, 1968. As a child Witney enjoyed ballet, jazz and tap dancing; as she got older she progressed towards modern dance. As a student at Western High School (Class of 1986); Witney demonstrated her passion for leadership and advocacy as the President of her Senior Class and throughout other organizations.

Witney attended Spelman College and later graduated from the University of Florida in 1990 with a degree in Finance. Witney spent several years as a bank officer at Nations Bank. In her spare time Witney volunteered her time as a child and AIDS awareness advocate. Witney later attended Coppin State University where she completed prerequisite classes to prepare for medical school. Witney worked full time and commuted back and forth from Pennsylvania to Maryland each day after she was accepted into Hahnemann Medical School. While completing her medical school studies, Witney volunteered her time to support victims of abuse at a battered women's shelter. At the time of her death, Witney continued her passion for service as a community advocate by serving as a member of the Mayor's Task force for Drug and Alcohol abuse under the leadership of Baltimore Mayor, Martin O'Malley.

### *A life interrupted...*

After medical school, Witney was accepted into the competitive University of Maryland Medical Center Psychiatry Residency Program. Witney met James in a local store in Baltimore. Shortly after meeting, a relationship developed that resulted in James moving into Witney's home. While in public, James portrayed himself as a college educated, government professional; in private he became controlling of Witney and began to objectify her as his prize possession; often isolating her from her family and dictating her appearance all while emotionally abusing her. That was until one day, Witney discovered that the man who was controlling her really was a modern day con artist. After separating from their toxic relationship; Witney, who remained focused on her career and community advocacy continued her mission to make a difference; that was until one day her life was interrupted by a knock at the door. When Witney opened her door she met face to face with the person who would ultimately take her breath away.

### *Her life silenced...*

The end? Not quite; the prosecutor at Witney's trial mentioned that she felt as though Witney was murdered because of what she discovered. After an intense trial to which the murderer refused to participate in; the presiding judge stated that never in his time on the bench had he met someone so "glib" about taking away the life of another individual. Convicted of first degree murder and sentenced to life, as the murderer was escorted from the courtroom, he announced " So what, everything she had, I gave to her, I owned her!

Guess you won't hear her voice again!"... The end, not quite,  
the mission continues.....

#### ***OUR MISSION AND PURPOSE***

**Witney's Lights** is named after the late Dr. Witney Holland Rose, a University of Maryland psychiatrist who was murdered in 2003 by her ex-boyfriend. Witney's Lights is a grassroots non-profit organization committed to eliminating domestic violence through awareness, education, prevention, advocacy and a commitment to advancing the initiatives laid out in the landmark Violence against Women Act of 1994.

Some of our activities include:

- ❖ **Leadership Institute for Guiding and Helping Tomorrow's Servants (L.I.G.H.T)** is a youth education program committed to training and empowering youth leaders within troubled communities. Students are invited to participate in the Leadership Institute based upon their sincere desire to become educated about the violence that plagues their environment and their commitment to make a difference by giving back to their community. As a fellow of **Witney's L.I.G.H.T.S**, students receive domestic violence awareness and life skill training that will prepare them to serve as effective leaders in their community. The Leadership Institute is staffed with highly qualified instructors who are experts in the fields of leadership, education, medicine, social services and community resources. Students are exposed to both traditional classroom settings as well as diverse cultural experiences.
- ❖ **The Witney's Lights** initiative collaborates with law enforcement, regional shelters and mental health professionals to assist victims and their families transitioning out of abusive relationships. Workshops are conducted on victim's advocacy and recognize citizens and survivors who are committed to ending domestic violence.
- ❖ **Witney's Lights** sponsors a domestic violence awareness walk to promote unity and commitment to ending domestic violence.
- ❖ **Witney's Lights** produces and distributes a wide array of multimedia products focused on awareness and prevention of domestic violence.
- ❖ **Witney's Lights** has established the Dr. Witney Holland Rose Memorial Scholarship. This generous scholarship is given annually to a student that exemplifies the characteristics of Dr. Witney H. Rose. Recipients are individuals who are hardworking, committed to making a difference in their community, have a desire to explore a career in medical science and will continue to carry the light of service that was once carried by Dr. Rose.
- ❖ **Witney's Lights** collaborates with local agencies, hotels and community outreach programs to provide temporary safe shelters for victims of domestic violence.

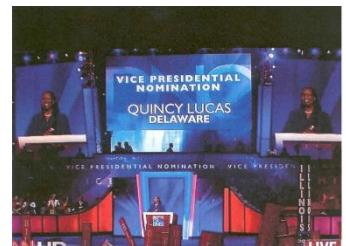
